1. Welcome and Announcements

Dr. Rob Rutenbar welcomed the Council members and called the meeting to order at 12:07pm.

2. April 16, 2019 URC Meeting Minutes

The April meeting minutes had been circulated to the Council and were approved *nem con*.

3. Updates

Dr. Rutenbar gave an update on Intellectual Property policy changes, noting that a new framework has been introduced. There is an IP Policy committee in place with broad representation from across university, co-chaired by Professor Adam Liebovich, Associate Dean for Research in the Dietrich School, and Rory Cooper, a Distinguished Professor in the School of Health and Rehabilitative Sciences and Director of the Human

Engineering Research Laboratory. The plan is to have a draft of the new policy at the end of semester. This will go out on a website for public commentary, followed by meetings to discuss next steps. Hopefully we will have a solid policy in place by end of academic year. Dr. Rutenbar noted that things are going very well so far.

Dr. Rutenbar gave an update on the revision of the consulting policy (external activities), noting that there is a lot of overlap with our Conflict of Interest policies. He noted that the current consulting policy was written in 1988 and is only ~500 words long, leaving some things out that should be there. Provost Ann Cudd and Dr. Rutenbar are co-leading recruiting for this committee and are looking for wide range of input from many different disciplines, from all different ranks.

4. Update on COIR Disclosure Committee

Dr. Rutenbar mentioned that there is a short-term committee currently working on redesigning the COI disclosure mechanism, as the current mechanism is rather dated and is focused on only a narrow slice of the Pitt community. Dr. Rutenbar noted that it will be replaced by a web form and that they are working on making a database to enable more streamlined routing. They are looking to ask as few questions as possible to get the needed info.

5. Pitt Momentum Funds

Dr. Mike Holland gave a presentation on Pitt's new Momentum Funds. He noted that the SVCR and Provost are putting significant resources into this new funding model that will enable researchers to put together teams and go after larger grants as well as scaling grants. He noted that teaming grants will require investigators from multiple schools, and that one can be community member outside of Pitt (though not faculty at another university).

It was noted that Med School faculty will be able to participate in Teaming and Scaling grants but not the Seeding grants.

It was noted that SSOE has Teaming grants as well, but that it is not an issue to have proposals for both.

It is still being worked out specifically who will review proposals for these grants.

Dr. Holland also noted that they will be restructuring and redefining Seeding Grants in order to streamline the proposal requirements.

6. Revised Guidelines for CDRA

Dr. Rutenbar noted that we are going to be restructuring the Chancellor's Distinguished Research Awards. He noted that these awards are currently dominated by STEM/Health Sciences and that we want to send a signal that awards are there for everyone. Under the new structure, with preference for review within three separate tracks: one for arts/humanities/etc. (including law), one for STEM, and one for health sciences. We will also be paring down nominations to 1 page of why, a 1-page bio-sketch, 1 recommendation, and reference letters. The hope is that this will result in more nominations.
